On August 5, 2019 Mayor Guthrie called a Public Hearing to Order for LDO and Code Amendments. None of the city's residence was in attendance. At 6:30 the mayor closed the hearing.

Good Hope City Council Minutes August 5, 2019

1. **Call to Order:** Mayor Guthrie called the meeting to order. Councilman William Malcom led the invocation. Councilman Jason Laughinghouse led the pledge.
2. **Roll Call** was performed by City Clerk, Renette Yancey. Councilman Josh Jameson was absent, all other members were present.
3. **Approval of Agenda:** Councilman David Mullis made a motion to accept the agenda. Councilman William Malcom seconded. All approved and the motion was passed.
4. **Approval of previous meeting's minutes:** Councilman David Mullis made a motion to accept the July Council minutes. Councilman Keith Prather seconded. All approved, Motion passed, and minutes were recorded.
5. **Public Forum:** There was no Public Forum.
6. **Committee Reports/Updates:**
 - A. **Tint for front doors:** The tinting on the front doors has been completed by Prestige Solar Tinting, this will help with the heat in City Hall during the summer months, the cost was \$198.00. This was paid for with SPLOST 3 monies as an upgrade to City Hall.
 - B. **Emergency Generator Update:** The Generator has been installed but needs a stronger internet signal for the update and other notices to be sent to selected cell phones. A cable will need to be run from the internet modem to the generator, Councilman Josh Jameson will be taking care of this. The gas company came to set the gas tank but because the telephone, water and electric wires are not marked he will wait until that is done before he begins digging. Mayor Guthrie made an appointment for this to happen this week.
 - C. **Service Delivery Strategy Update.** The Regional Commission kicked back the Service Delivery Strategy that we had voted on due to some of the wording. Adele Schirmer, the city manager of Social Circle, is working to correct the wording so it can be re-submitted and she will notify the cities when it is finished.
 - D. **Moina Michael Birthday/Poppy Run:** The Poppy Run is scheduled for August 17th. The Council is encouraged to share the information to their contacts to make this a fun time and to raise money for the Poppy Festival. After the run there will be a birthday celebration for Moina Michael's 150th Birthday at City Hall.
 - E. **HVAC Update:** Mayor Guthrie spoke with Jason Phelps about the lack of air conditioning at city hall. He gave 3 options.
1- Purchase 2-1800 BTU wall mount units to mount in City Hall for \$6400. 2- Purchase 2-2400 BTU wall mount units for City Hall and reroute the air going to the Clerk's office for \$7500. 3-Purchase 1200 BTU units for the Clerk and Mayors offices and redirect the air going to those offices into the main room for \$3000.00. Not Included in the above prices is the cost of any electrical work that would be needed. The Council had a few questions. The Mayor will get the answers and they will readdress this subject at the September meeting.
7. **Unfinished Business:** There is no unfinished business
8. **New Business**

A. LDO and Code of Ordinances updates: There are three (3) updates to the LDO. They are in the areas of (1) Soil, Erosion and Sedimentation (2) Alcohol and (3) the Tree Ordinance. The seconded reading was performed by Mayor Guthrie. The Mayor asked for a motion to accept the updates. Councilman Keith Prather made the motion Councilman William Malcom seconded all approved and the motion was passed.

B. TV Monitor for City Hall: A motion was made by Councilman William Malcom to purchase a TV monitor for city hall. Councilman David Mullis seconded. All voted in favor and the motion was passed. It was decided to purchase a 65-inch Vizio with smart chrome cast. The purchase of a wall mount with a locked case will also be purchased for security.

Council Discussion

A. New Banners: Mayor Guthrie shared several brochures of flags for the city. The council will continue to look for flags that represent the city of Good Hope.

B. T-SPLOST: The want list for the year 2021 was discussed. Filling in the ditches and putting in drains and curbs between Highway 186 and City Hall would be the first on the list for the City.

C. Painting the interior of City Hall: The estimated cost to paint City Hall is \$3750.00. This estimate was given by Adam Yunis LLC. The mayor will get another estimate from Richard Adcock and the council will discuss it at the next meeting.

D. New Printer for City Hall: There is an interest in purchasing a new printer for the clerk's office. We would like to purchase an auto scan/color laser printer. The suggested make and model are Brother, Xerox or Cannon. The old printer will be placed in the mayor's office.

E. September Meeting: Because of Labor Day it was decided that the September meeting would take place the following Monday September 9, 2019,

Adjourn: Mayor Guthrie called for a motion to conclude the meeting. Councilman David Mullis made the motion, Councilman Keith Prather seconded. Motion passed and the meeting was adjourned.
